- 9:30am** **Barbara Joy Peel Stoneware Pottery & Functional Art**
Barbara-Joy Peel has been creating decorative functional pottery and individual art pieces for 39 years. Her desire to unite beauty and function is evident in her distinctive glazing techniques and designs which are simple in form yet elegant in style. Her graceful forms in porcelain are decorated in crystalline glazes. Barbara is now designing and creating one-of-a-kind jewellery in sterling silver. She is incorporating some of her silver into clay forms. Barbara teaches at the Haliburton School of the Arts and is the recipient of many pottery awards in Canada and Overseas.

**Haliburton Sculpture Forest
Conducted Tour**

The Haliburton Sculpture Forest is unique amongst sculpture gardens and sculpture parks in Canada and the world. The Haliburton Sculpture Forest is a year round facility. It is visited by walkers and bike riders from spring to late fall and, in the winter, by skiers. The forest is dominated by deciduous trees allowing for ease of viewing throughout the year. The sculptures, by design, reflect the environment in which they reside and the materials used to create them are in harmony with their surroundings. The site is preserved as a natural setting. The entire Sculpture Forest experience, which is unstructured and unscripted, encourages contemplation. Those who enjoy outdoor trails, a quiet environment and an artistic experience will thoroughly enjoy the Haliburton Sculpture Forest.
